Dear Parents, Teachers and Administrators;

TheCrayonBin.com has implemented a crayon-recycling program called 'Crayons-4-Crayons'. During the school year we will be bringing the program to as many schools as possible. This program encourages students to recycle something that kids of all ages can relate to... Crayons!!! This is a great teaching tool as well as helping to serve the community.

You can place containers in each classroom and/or the main office. The last page are signs for your containers you can use to collect the well-loved crayons. Students are asked to place any broken or crayon stubs into the containers and as a reward for recycling the school will receive a set of 'Recolor Our World All Star' recycled crayons for each pound of crayons the students place into the recycling containers. The students many bring broken and "well loved" crayons from home (with their parents permission, of course). PLEASE DO NOT remove the labels from the crayons because we need to know the manufacturer in order to sort them properly. Please remind them to take the crayons home they receive in restaurants, because they end up being thrown in the trash.

This can become a great instructional tool because it is something every student can relate to... Crayons. There is also some great information on our website TheCrayonBin.com. It may not seem very important but consider these facts:

- Just one manufacturer produces nearly **3 BILLION** crayons each year. That's an average of twelve million daily. How many of those end up in our landfills?
- Landfills are filling quickly. They are always looking for new locations for landfills. Would you like one in your backyard?
- Crayons are made from paraffin wax, a petroleum product. They take many years to biodegrade.
- This is a great teaching tool for the students. It is something they can easily relate to since they use crayons all the time.

# Crayons-4-Crayons Program

"The Crayon Bin Crayons-4-Crayons Program" is a recycling program, educational tool, community service and a "do your part for the environment" project. This program allows kids to really do something to help the earth on their level.

We all know that when we discard or throw things in the trash they end up in our landfills. Landfills are in short supply and waste management companies are looking for new locations to place another landfill. Most people don't want a landfill in their "backyard" so why not try to recycle and reuse to the extent that we can.

The best part about the program is the Crayons-4-Crayons Exchange. For every pound (a little more than 100 crayons) you will receive a set of new Recolor Our World All Star Crayons made from recycled stubs and broken crayons. Since we do not add or remove anything from the crayons during the recycling process, they are still as safe as the non-toxic ones you use everyday.




Lets keep our crayons out of the landfills.




